

DIES AT SEVENTY-THREE

Mrs. Jane Pack Passed Away at her Home in Bountiful, Sunday Morning.

Mrs. Jane Pack, widow of the late John Pack who was one of the original hundred and forty-three pioneers who entered the great Salt Lake Valley, in July of 1847, passed away of general debility at her home in West Bountiful at 1 o'clock Sunday morning. She was unconscious from the preceding Wednesday. Her health began failing about four years ago.

It was twenty-three years Saturday since her husband passed away.

Deceased was born in England seventy-three years ago Friday. She was among the early settlers of Bountiful where she has lived about all the time since she came here.

She was the mother of eleven children all of whom survive her. They are, Mrs. A. L. Buckland, Mrs. Silas Buckland, Quince Pack, Mrs. Annie Roberts, Mrs. A. U. Eldredge, Mrs. Frank Kohler, Mrs. T. J. Howard, Mrs. Frank Brown, Dr. F. J. Pack and Harold R. Pack.

The funeral services were held in the West Bountiful Meeting House, Thursday at 1 p. m.

Deceased was president of the West Ward Relief society for a great many years and also a counselor to the President of the Primary association.
